

Exam season 2022

Information for Year 11 students and their parents and carers

Over the course of the next week or so, we will be providing information to support students in their preparation for the forthcoming exams season. This information will be added to the exams section of the school website as it is published.

Students will be given their exam timetables in due course. They should check these carefully to ensure the entries are as they are expecting.

Later next week, we will publish the arrangements for the exams themselves and supplementary information to support students through the exams in the case they have questions. These arrangements will be very similar to those we have had in place for the mock exams. We will also publish details of special consideration, mainly focusing on what to do in cases of Covid when the exams are taking place.

- vocational and technical qualifications, including T Levels
- a combination of these qualifications

We state where any information only applies to a certain type of qualification. If you are not sure exactly which qualification you are taking, you should check this with your school, college or other exam centre.

The information in this guide about arrangements for vocational and technical qualifications also applies to other general qualifications, including the International Baccalaureate, core mathematics and Pre-U.

We call schools, colleges and other exam centres 'centres' in this guide.
